

THE NOVA SCOTIA HUMAN RIGHTS REMEDY

It's one of the biggest developments to ever impact persons with disabilities and the province's disability support sector: The Nova Scotia Human Rights Remedy is a five-year, legally binding agreement that guides government's work to transform the disability support system in Nova Scotia. It's called "the Remedy" because it is what government must do to remedy the historic discrimination against people with disabilities in Nova Scotia.

Key recommendations of the Remedy include closing all large institutions and supporting people with disabilities to live in their community of choice, and developing a new system of individualized funding for people with disabilities. The Nova Scotia Department of Opportunities and Social Development is keeping DASC informed of progress and timelines associated with the Remedy, and we look forward to being involved with Remedy priorities.
